Legal Framework I

- Switzerland is not an EC memberstate
- Few Court Cases
- Transport distance and Exhaust Classes
- EC Case Law "à la carte"



Legal Framework II

- GPA III (National Treatment / Non-discrimination)
- GPA IV (Rules of Origin)
- GPA VI (Technical Specifications)
- GPA VIII (Qualification of Suppliers)
- GPA XIII (Awarding of Contracts)
- FPPA 21 (Award Criteria)



Product Specifications I

- GPA III, IV, VI
- Ecology of Products
- Ecology of Production Processes
- Ecology of the Supplier? \rightarrow Qualification



Product Specifications II

- Ecology can be a Quality Characteristic of the Product
- Freedom of Definition vs. Non-discrimination:
 - a.) as long as there is enough (<u>international</u>) competition ...
 - b.) justified by public interests (public concerns)
 - c.) more market restriction requires more necessity
 - d.) equivalents must be admitted



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Product Specifications III

- Examples
 - → Procurement of Recycled Paper
 - → Procurement of a "Minergie"-Standard building
 - → Construction with FSC Certified Wood
 - → Instructions about Utilisation of Demolition Waste
 - → Transport Distance of Stones?
 - → Architects Visiting the Construction Site by Public Transports?



Conditions of Admission and Qualification Criteria I

- GPA VIII: Non-discrimination and Essentiality
- No General Optimisation of Bidders, but
 - bidders must obey applicable law when performing
 - ecological qualification can be required if <u>necessary</u> (<u>essential</u>)
- Currently No Possibility to Sanction Past Environmental Law Infringements



Conditions of Admission and Qualification Criteria II

- Underwater Concrete Works:
 requirement of similar reference objects that prove
 necessary ecological skills allowed
- Ecology Certificates:

If essential for Good Performance e.g. waste management on construction site



Award Criteria I

- GPA XIII / FPPA 21
- (Economically) Most Advantageous Tender: pure cost efficiency or quality in a wide sense?
 - Step I: Life Cycle Costs / Durability
 - Step II: Measuring the Impact of the Product
 - Step III: Measuring the Production Process



Award Criteria II

- What is Allowed in Terms of Product Specifications is Even More Allowed Under Award Criteria
- No Measuring of Bidder's General Behviour



Award Criteria III

- Criterion Pertinence and Weighing Relevancy
- Transport Type / Transport Distance
- Ecological Impacts of the Product
- Recyclability of Products
- "Grey Energy" of Products



Conclusions

- Focus on Product and Performance
- General Rules Apply Perfectly on Ecological Issues
- Swiss Public Procurement Law is Not Limited to the Mere Economic Effectiveness, But Allows Quality Criteria in a Large Sense
